Call for lasting tribute to Shirley Connolly OAM

I call on Campbelltown City Council to adopt my proposal to rename the Coronation Park Netball Complex in Minto in honour of the late Shirley Connolly OAM.

I wrote to the former Mayor of Campbelltown proposing that the complex be renamed 'The Shirley Connolly Coronation Park Netball Complex' as a permanent tribute to the much-loved community volunteer.

Ms Connolly, who sadly passed away in June at the age of 87, was the driving force behind Campbelltown District Netball Association for the last 30 years.

Ms Connolly was instrumental in advocating for the expansion and enhancement of the netball courts and facilities at Coronation Park in Minto. The facility is rated one of the best in NSW, and hosts netball competitions at local and State level.

The new name would be a fitting tribute to Ms Connolly, who was a giant of netball in



Campbelltown, Macarthur and across the State.

It would honour Ms Connolly's dedication to the sport and provide an enduring legacy for her valuable contributions to netball in Campbelltown and Macarthur.

Ms Connolly was a committed volunteer who believed in the value of service to our local community. We will remember Ms Connolly for her grassroots connection to the Campbelltown association. Our community will be forever grateful for Ms Connolly's advocacy, commitment and valuable contributions to netball in Campbelltown and the Macarthur region.

I hope that Council will honour my bid to name the Minto netball complex in Ms Connolly's memory and, in doing so, pay tribute to a wonderful community member.

Driver Testing Centre passes the test

A dedicated driver testing centre in Macquarie Fields has proven popular for people wanting to get on the road.

The Macquarie Fields Driver Testing Centre opened in December 2023 to increase access to driving tests, particularly for overseas licence holders required to convert to a NSW licence as part of regulation changes.

For anyone aiming to get their P or L plates, about 300 driving tests and 300 computer-based knowledge tests are available each week.

I was delighted to join Minister for Customer Service and Digital Government, Jihad Dib, at the Macquarie Fields Driver Testing Centre, located at Building H Ground Floor of the TAFE Campus at 32 Victoria Road, Macquarie Fields. The centre is open Monday to Friday, 8am to 4pm.

A team of up to 15 Service NSW team members including driver testers work to provide high-quality customer service and assist people who are progressing through the licensing journey.

The great thing is people don't need to wait to book a driving or knowledge test at Macquarie Fields. With new timeslots opening weekly for six weeks in advance, you can book a day and time that suits you.

MAKING RENTING FAIRER

The Minns Labor Government is delivering on its election commitment to make renting fairer by ending no fault evictions in NSW and implementing a new portable bonds scheme.

NSW is facing a housing affordability crisis with rents and mortgage repayments the largest single cost of living pressure facing the people of NSW.

- Ending no fault evictions in NSW will give more security to renters and certainty to the rental market. There will still be reasonable grounds to end a tenancy, but not just to put up the rent.
- A new portable bonds scheme will take pressure off renters by allowing their bond to be transferred directly to their new property when moving homes.
- **Ending practice** of rental property platforms soliciting payments from applicants for background checks.

STATION UPGRADE NEARS THE NEXT STAGE

The Macquarie Fields Station upgrade is progressing ahead of construction starting later this year.

The community consultation period for the Review of Environmental Factors for the upgrade recently closed.

This marks a significant milestone for the project, which will see the installation of two new lifts and a new passenger footbridge, as well as other facilities such as a family accessible toilet and improved security, creating an improved experience for the elderly, people with disability and carers and people with prams. The station will also be modernised with a new accessible entry forecourt, improved canopy coverage, accessible parking, and landscaping.

Initial community feedback has been positive, with more than 60 submissions received.

Feedback to date has included:

- Overall support for the project and improving accessibility at Macquarie Fields Station.
- Support for proposed safety enhancements and suggestions for additional measures such as ticket barriers, trimming overgrown trees to improve sight lines and provision of additional lighting and CCTV in and around the station.
- Support for the designated Kiss and Ride zone, including increasing the number of spaces and flow of traffic especially during peak periods.

Pembroke Road and Durham Street

Many people have raised safety concerns with me about the intersection of Pembroke Road and Durham Street, Minto. Traffic volumes have increased in recent years following the opening of the redeveloped Passfield Park School in Durham Street.

The intersection has a petrol station on one

side and the school on the other side, with a north-bound merging lane.

Safety is of paramount concern to local residents, and I have made representations to the NSW Minister for Roads on this matter a number of times.

I am pleased to report that Transport for NSW has advised that traffic lights will be installed at this intersection, with works to start in 2025.

This is a significant safety improvement for all road users, and I encourage you to contact my Electorate Office to stay up-todate on developments.

Pembroke Road and Minto Road

Constituents often voice their concerns about the intersection of Pembroke Road and Minto Road. Featuring a large bend, the road becomes slippery when wet and there has been a number of vehicle incidents over the years.

Transport for NSW is currently reviewing this intersection to determine improvements to make the intersection safer for all road users. Contact my Electorate Office to stay posted on developments.

LITHIUM-ION BATTERY SAFETY

The NSW Government will impose strict new standards on lithium-ion battery powered e-bikes, e-scooters and similar products. Lithium-ion battery related fires are the fastest growing fire risk in NSW.

In response to growing demand for these products and increased community risk from poor quality versions, sellers of devices like e-bikes or e-scooters in NSW will soon face penalties of up to \$825,000 if they do not meet the strict new standards.

From 1 February 2025, e-bikes, e-scooters, hoverboards and e-skateboards will be required to meet the new product standards. New testing, certification and labelling requirements will be introduced in a staged process.

The NSW Government is taking a proactive approach to ensure these products meet strict safety criteria to help save lives and protect property.

New high school makes progress

Plans to deliver a new high school in Edmondson Park are well underway. The high school will include fit-for-purpose classrooms and core facilities to meet enrolment demand in Edmondson Park and support our growing community.

The new high school will accommodate up to 800 students. The project is on track for completion by Day 1, Term 1 of 2027.

Award of the main works contract for construction of the new high school is anticipated to occur in late 2024, subject to planning approval. The department will progress with the school's detailed design once a design and construction contractor is engaged.
